ELAC update: there is a lot of work to do to increase engagement in the ELAC. The joint meetings are not working for multilingual families. Linda is working to find more ways to notice meetings and make sure families are getting the information they need in their native language.

Lessons learned for next year: Parent Square was a barrier for some parents, and with help there was more success. next year we will include a parent onboarding session for all parents to get familiarized with the school's systems and communications methods.

Buddy classes are doing walking field trips to Feliz Creek and Burger's My Way (ice cream!) Pomolita field trip took place for 5th and 6th-graders to see the school, meet the principal, and find out what it's like there.

PBIS discipline flow chart being finalized this week with MCOE support (Stephen Hahn)
Staff appreciation week in early May. Parents contributed and we had some special treats for teachers that week.

Tomorrow is our final PBL night and our 7th and 8th grade UISA students will be sharing their films.

## C. Community School Director Report

Community schools piece of Cinco de Mayo event was bringing the Aztec dancers and Flamenco Mendocino. Linda is working on programs for next year to help empower parents (esp. multilingual or trad. marginalized families). Linda will be setting up workshops for parents with The Parent Institute for Quality Education. Linda will also be bringing other workshop like PPP and also including programming for Motherhood and Fatherhood is Sacred, so we can support our families with parenting skills and empower them to navigate their relationship with the school. Linda recently attended the "Power of Showing Up". Mental health awareness training. Native American Motivational Day at Mendocino College was a huge success with students, they loved the day and got see what ti was like to be a college student for a day. Preschool licensing is moving forward and all our community partners are eager to help. Getting ready for our very first summer enrichment program: contracts and schedules will be out by Friday.

## A. Fiscal Updates from Ed Tec

May Revise came out a couple weeks ago. COLA (8.2%) increase was nominal and impacts state SPED and LCAP funding. It also impacts nutrition funds as well. Arts Music and instruction and learning recovery Block grant was decreased but legislator is fighting to keep it. Prop 25 funding will come in and backfill this funding source for future years, and will provide funding based on FRPM#s. This will be an ongoing funding source rather than one time funding.
